Horatio arrives at the office for his first day of work.

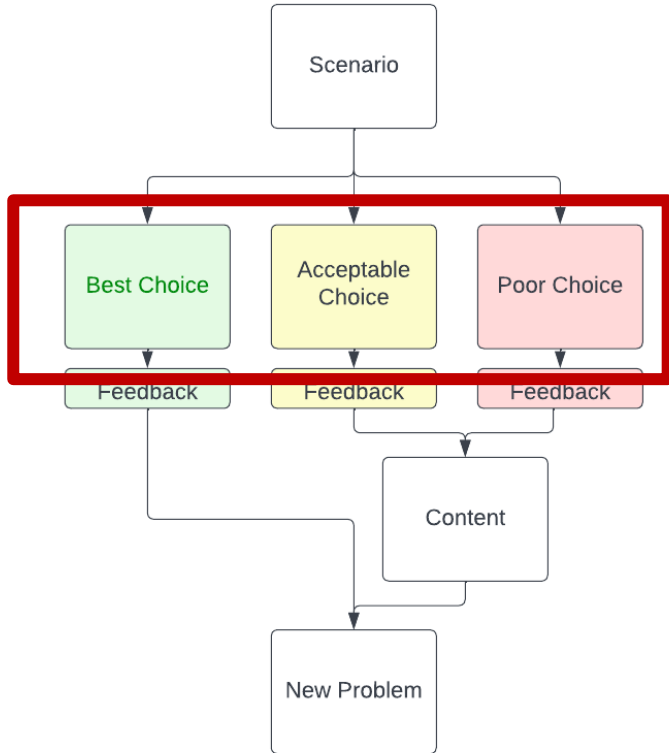


Hi. Today is my first day. I'm looking for Hector Almeriez.
